## Window Project



The Old Courthouse Museum has 61 stained glass windows in the Law Library, Courtroom, first floor hallways, and exhibit galleries that contribute to the historic architecture of the building. The windows were designed in six different patterns. Although there are some patterns that are repeated, each window is unique. In 2021 the Museum began a process of restoring and cleaning the historic windows. So far, 16 windows have been completed. This painstaking restoration costs approximately \$2,000 per window and will continue for a number of years. Gifts of any size are welcome to contribute to this ongoing project.

## Bring Back the Music!

For 34 years, the Siouxland Heritage Museums have brought free folk, jazz, and traditional music to the public at the Old Courthouse Museum. The annual Winter Concert Series is scheduled to begin November 29th and run Fridays through February. The series is free to the public and is supported by donations and sponsorships.
